The University of Louisiana at Lafayette Compliance Program Guidelines for Prospective Student-Athletes and Their Student Hosts

The following guidelines have been established to ensure that the hosting of prospective student-athletes is conducted in a manner consistent with NCAA, University Louisiana at Lafayette, and Sun Belt Conference regulations.

Student-athletes who serve as a host must understand that each and every one of them is an official representative of the Department of Athletics and the University of Louisiana at Lafayette. Therefore, appropriate conduct is expected at all times.

It is the responsibility of the student host to exemplify to prospective student-athletes the type of behavior expected of athletes at the University of Louisiana at Lafayette.

- 1. Underage drinking (below 21) is illegal in the state of Louisiana. Prospective student-athletes are not allowed to indulge in this activity. It is the host's responsibility to discourage and report transgression of this law.
- 2. If a prospective student-athlete is of legal age (21) he/she may enter a local bar, it is the student host's responsibility to ensure that the prospective student-athlete is aware that alcohol abuse will NOT be tolerated. Prospects who are 18 years old are allowed to enter into some bars but are not allowed to purchase or drink alcohol. Prospects who are not yet 18 years old are prohibited from entering a local bar.
- 3. The University of Louisiana at Lafayette will not tolerate sexual harassment or the arrangement of sexual favors by anyone associated with our athletic teams. Student hosts must be aware of the University's prohibition of this type of activity and work to ensure that prospects they are hosting conduct themselves appropriately.
- 4. Prospective student-athletes and student hosts may be provided up to \$40.00 per day for entertainment expenses. It is the host's responsibility to handle the monies involved. At no time may cash be given to prospective student-athletes.
- 5. A prospective student-athlete may not have contact with representatives of the University's athletic interest (boosters) for any reason. It is the student host's responsibility to ensure that such contacts do not take place with entertaining prospective student-athletes.
- 6. It is the responsibility of the University to ensure the safety and well being of prospective student-athletes visiting our campus. At the same time, it is incumbent upon prospective student-athletes and their student hosts to avoid any situations or activities that would jeopardize their safety and that would violate University, NCAA, Sun Belt Conference and/or local laws, rules, and regulations.
- 7. At no time should prospective student-athletes be taken more than 30 miles from campus. The purpose of the visit is to experience campus life.
